# **Sunday Morning Formation – Sunday School**

This formational time happens between our 9:00 a.m. and 11:15 a.m. services. It is open to everyone, even friends or family who may not attend our parish! Sunday School Events will be from 10:10–11:00 a.m. on Sunday mornings in our youth building, Carpenter Hall. We have two groups that meet: Junior High grades 7th through 9th and Senior High grades 10th through 12th. Each group meets in their assigned room on the second floor of Carpenter Hall.

# Sunday Night Events (also known as EYC or Youth Group)

Although EYC describes our whole community, it also represents our fellowship time on Sunday nights. We cover all our basics on Sunday nights, and our primary purpose is to have fun, get to know each other, and get to know our faith. EYC happens from 5:00–8:00 p.m. and can be summarized as a youth gathering for fellowship, Dinner, program, and worship, as well as an occasional outreach activity or fun outing in the area. A parent or volunteer provides dinner, and adult advisors and youth staff are present.

# Weekly Small Groups & Wednesday Night Live

This year, we will continue weekly small groups in separate cohorts, divided by grade. 7th, 8th, and 9th grades will continue to meet at Chick-fil-A at 6–7 p.m., now on Wednesday nights!

Then, the 10th and 11th grades will have a separate group from our 12th-grade seniors. These groups will meet thrice a month and take a break on the weeks of parish-wide Wednesday night dinners, often hosted in the Parish Hall.

We have so much fun on Wednesday nights and look forward to seeing you there!

#### **Confirmation – for 9th and 10th graders**

We are excited to continue our confirmation classes, and things are moving fast! Confirmation Sunday is November 5 at the 9 a.m. service. We still have much information to cover before then. We will be spending intentional time together as we discuss topics in depth. We also have a Confirmation Retreat **on October 22, 2023**, to help teach programs and have one-on-one sessions.
